OUR FIRST 25 YEARS

PERHAPS the best way to commence the story of Yokine's first 25 years, 1959-84, would be to quote the first report of our foundation President, Mr. E. W. Newton. He wrote:

For record purposes it might be interesting to note that in May 1959, the question of starting a worthwhile activity in the district was discussed by three or four people and the original idea was a bowling club plus community tennis courts.

It was quickly realised that in view of the requirements of the licensing act, the two activities could not work together.

Mr Arthur Cousins made the original suggestion regarding the bowling club, and following discussions with other male members of the community, it was decided to hold a public meeting, which was held in the Yokine-Joondanna R.S.L. Hall on June 11, 1959.

The attendance was 29 persons, and on a motion by Mr L. A. Kranz, seconded by Mr F. Berry, it was decided to form the Yokine Districts Bowling Club, which later became an incorporate body.

So from records, the five people who masterminded our Club were — then membership. Arthur Cousins, Ken Plowman, Ern Newton, Lyn Kranz and Peter Dawson.

The first four gentlemen have all become presidents of our Club, whilst Peter was the original Treasurer.

It can be seen that the R.S.L. certainly have grass roots in our Club and indeed their activities still are carried on within the confines of our Clubhouse and the subbranch is among the largest in the metro area.

It was on the corner of Wanneroo Road and Wiluna Street. It was only a tin shed but if you were an early club member, many pleasant memories would come back at its mention. This was the place where much of our early business was conducted, many social evenings were enjoyed, even if when it rained the floorboards lapped the water. Our gatherings were about 50% of the

On August 20, 1959 in the same Hall, the Yokine Districts Ladies Bowling Club was formed on a motion by Mrs Chester, seconded by Mrs Stubberfield.



Suffice to say that they know personally what efforts they channelled to our Club and would be very happy with the results. So, a big thank-you from the members to the workers, past, present and future.

So now the stage was 1962.

set for lots of hard work and headaches, land had to be selected and then released by the Crown, plans of our area developed, building, plans, finance, licensing court applications and a host of other things arranged with the Perth Road Board — later the Shire of Perth and still later the City of Stirling. It can be seen that our first committee certainly had a busy time.

Once the land was allotted in came the workers and soon our selected site began to look like a bowling club.

With many offers of help from other local clubs in our area and the use of greens offered, we finally were hosted by the Bayswater Club and even used their greens for our first pennant year and Club Championships. It was 1962 before we played on our greens and late that year our Clubhouse was opened — the keys being handed over on November 29,

Just after the start we lost about four hundred shrubs with a black frost, and we have been caught by cockeyed bobs twice.


The last one left a trail of major destruction, but with magnificent aid from

25th Anniversary Yokine Bowling Club 1959-1984

The Yokine Bowling Club was founded at a public meeting held in June 1959, when a foundation committee was elected to form a bowling club. Negotiations with the Perth Road Board (now City of Stirling) began, resulting in a \$40,000 loan, repayable over 21 years, being provided in 1960.

1961, when 2 teams of 6th Division Saturday Club. Since occupying the number of Saturday a 208 players. Increased R.W.A.B.A. affiliation commenced in 1961, when 2 teams of 24 players were entered in 5th and 6th Division Saturday Pennants, using Bayswater as home Club. Since occupying the present site (in November 1962) the number of Saturday Pennant Divisions has grown to 13 with 208 players. Increased membership necessitated expansion of club facilities to cater for the present 385 men and 200 ladies. Cost of this work has been funded over the years with additional loans from the Bank of N.S.W. The Club is now valued at well over \$750,000 with an annual turnover in excess of \$480,000.

Considerable success has been achieved on the greens, with the club winning 15 Pennants, 5 Shields, 18 Plaques, besides numerous other events. Three members have also attained State representation.

Yokine has been ably supported by an excellent Ladies' Club which has a very successful record, winning 6 major State Titles, 3 Pennants, and many other events. They have also provided the Sportman of the Year 1974 and 1980, Bowler of the Year 1980, and three State representatives on numerous occasions.

In attendance were over two hundred members and partners plus an official guest list including representatives of the City of Stirling, the R.W.A.B.A. and W.A.L.B.A.





So they borrowed the cash and got the land. Ran socials and the money rolled in. So slowly and surely the project progressed With ladies and men chipping in.










TERRY SHERIDAN, winner of the men's singles. Terry defeated Sars Ryan in the final.






BETTY LYLE, winner of the ladies' singles. Betty defeated Elsie Herbert in the final.



Right: Bruce Walter and Bill Bass won the men's pairs championship. Chris Busing and Alan Davis were runners-up.




BEER ALL ROUND






