WHATS HAPPENING & WHEN?

We have TWO types of sellers.

1. CARBOOT: For people wanting the chance to empty that spare cupboard/shed or suitcase e.g.: Plants / Clothing / Bric-a-brac / Household items / Collectables /Toys / Books etc ~ \$10.00 per bay [1 Bay = 1 Car Park Space*]

2. HANDMADE: For people who want to sell their own handmade items e.g.: any products made by the seller (excluding food items*) ~ \$15.00 per bay [1 Bay = 1 Car Park Space*]

Con Migro interviews Shane Shaw

Where were you born? - St Annes, Mt Lawley WA.

Material status - Married 31 years to Helen. 1 brother and lots of stepbrothers and sisters. Lived in then Port Hedland and North Perth.

How many children do you have? - Dylan Thomas Shaw soon to play pennant Bowls.

Business/working life since time you left school? -

Handy man at 17 at the Cooke Point Caravan Park in Port Hedland. Mac Robertson Miller Airline (MMA) then Ansett in Port Hedland, Groote Eylandt, Kununurra and then Perth Airport. Also flew to Xmas and Cocos Islands 2 times a week for 12 months whilst working in Ansett Reservations on the computers. Private investigator and Debt Recovery agencies then eventually out on my own from around 1994. Still working.

Schools or school Attended/educated? - Our Lady of Grace Convent (next to North Beach Bowling Club), North Innaloo Primary, Scarborough High School, Port Hedland Senior High School, Carine Glade High School. Didn't finish year 12 and started work at 17. Also did a double degree History and law at Murdoch University but unfortunately met my wife Helen and with 1 year left to finish my degree decided to stop.

Work Employment? Shaw Documents WA. I currently serve legal documents for various Government departments and solicitors. Also conduct property evictions for major banks.

What attracted you to Lawn Bowls? - My dad.

What type of music do you like? - Country music, especially Slim Dusty, Merle Haggard, Willie Nelson etc. Also have 4 guitars.

How do you see the future of Lawn Bowls? -Lawn bowls when I started, I recall 4 players in a section for State Singles and over 1500 entries. Now 3 in a section and only maybe 300 players entering. I think Yokine had 13-14 pennant sides and always a green full of Bankers. I believe that bowls needs to change 3 rinks in a pennant side and 8 teams in a division

With the advent of Mixed gender in the coming season. I personally believe this is good for the sport and will obviously help clubs with fielding sides each week. Yokine have very good lady bowlers who I believe are capable enough to play in the men's 1st division side and there could be some stiff competition when it comes time for the selectors to pick a side. Unless Bowls WA changes the format of pennants, I feel the game will just continue on as it is and not progress. There does seem to be a lot more younger people starting to play which is good for the sport.

What do think should change at the YDBC? -

I would like to see the City of Stirling create a massive Hub for not only Lawn Bowls but other sports and turn Yokine into the Club that everyone wants to be a part of. The sporting playing fields around Yokine are an ideal location to build a brand-new massive sporting complex. Indoor and outdoor bowling, restaurant and bar and we will be the envy of every club.
