

Business life from the time you left school?

After High School (1964) worked in Commonwealth Public Service for 1 year then left and started an Agricultural business with my brother.

Schools attended?

My school life was Primary at Osborne Park and Secondary at Tuart Hill High

Tell us about your work/business life.

Agricultural business for a few years then the family bought a cattle farm at Coolup which was sold in 1976. After that I drove for a truck company out of Kewdale but saw no future so started TAFE to obtain a Real Estate license, which I achieved in 1979. Worked for an agency till 1981 when I started Main Realty with my brother in Osborne Park. I bought my brother out in 1985 and stayed as a Sole trader till 2005 when joined The Professionals Group which was a Marketing Group, not a franchise. Following the passing of my wife Maria in 2015 I remained in business till 2017 when staff offered to buy me out which I accepted and have been retired since then.

What are your interests now?

My main interests in life are now Lawn Bowls, Alfa Romeo cars, my daughters, and my lovely partner Fiona.

Do you follow a WAFL team? If so, who?

I follow Swan Districts and have so since 1959.

Do you follow an AFL team? If so, who?

I follow the Eagles and have been a member since 1998

Where do you live? On the way through life which other places have you lived?

When I was born the family lived on a pig farm in Balcatta which was sold to developers in 1964 when we moved to Forrestfield but that farm was 50% resumed by State Gov't for Kewdale Marshalling Yards. Subsequently lived at Coolup till sold then moved to Yokine where I have been till my most recent move to Dianella in 2012.

Tell us about your involvement with the YDBC.

I have been a member of the club since 1985 and it occupies a lot of my time. Spent 4 years as president (during COVID) and many years volunteering which I continue to do. How do you see the future of Lawn Bowls?

The future of Lawn Bowls is at a delicate stage with mixed gender competition becoming the norm and there is nothing wrong with that. It will be interesting to see how Pennants unfolds in the next couple of years but I hope our older members embrace change and participate with the same enthusiasm.

How do you see the sport progressing? What is required to improve it?

There may need to be a change in the pennant format to rejuvenate our game and make sure it retains the enthusiasm to keep pennants alive.

What is the future of the YDBC?

The talk of late that BOWLS WA want to relocate their offices to our Club would be a great outcome for YDBC if it is done properly and all parties, (City of Stirling, BOWLS WA, State Gov't, and YDBC) can get their acts together. Time is important as these things drag on for too long and nobody wants to make the initial move.

What should be done to improve things @ The YDBC?

YDBC needs to undertake a plan to get a roof over A green to have a facility that can be used 365 days of the year. This will give our club the benefit of being able to provide a facility that can be used by BOWLS WA to stage finals and other interstate events here.

Your thoughts on the game now becoming an open gender in pennant games?

Open gender can only be good for our game so long as all members embrace the concept.

How should Bowls be promoted to attract younger people?

Attracting younger people is going to be a challenge for all bowling clubs, but providing off-thegreen activities for younger people is a start. The idea of a roof over A green means the Barefoot activity can be played over a longer season and with the Jack Attack and this can provide a source of younger people if promoted towards these players. I am sure many young people would appreciate the game of lawn bowls.
